


Y8 History

We are VERY excited, and can't wait, to welcome Rachel Martin and 'Gus' from Pawtential Unleashed into school on 11th November! Benefits of a support dog visiting school can have many positive influences on children and young people, such as helping to build self-esteem as well as helping to build interaction skills with others. There are cognitive benefits as support dogs can help to stimulate memory and problem solving skills. Mental and emotional health benefits show that support dogs help to reduce anxiety and help lift moods. Interacting with therapy dogs can also help to improve a students' reading skills, stimulate memory and problem-solving skills, optimise executive-functioning skills, support concentration, attention, motivation, and relaxation which in turn reflects reduction of high stress levels which inhibit effective learning and performance. Support dogs are relatively new to schools but have been recognised as a positive addition. Twelve Ofsted reports since 2016 have praised schools for using support dogs.





This is Gus! Gus is just beginning his career as a support dog and is currently going through training on a daily basis. We can't wait to see the impact a support dog has within school! Watch this space...
