

Maths/STEM KS2 Challenge: Two Y6 teams travelled to Mowden Hall School this week to compete in this annual inter-schools' contest. We are proud to share that they came joint 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> positions out of 20 schools from across the region. "Murderous Maths" author, Kjartan Poskitt, attended the event and talked with the children about mathematical problems and fascinating science facts about space. "Writing Borders" KS3 Enrichment Project: As part of Hexham Book Festival, 15 of our KS3 pupils were selected to work with a visiting author and illustrator from Latvia. The children explored the concept of borders (physical, geographical and emotional) before producing their own short stories. Alex (Y7) even had his story performed at the Queen's Hall, Hexham, where pupils also listened to stories being read in different languages. Our pupils were complimented on the quality of their engagement with this enrichment project. ## **CLASS ZONE**

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Y5 pupils have been having fun challenging each other in STEM activities. Here are the three winning towers for the Tallest Tower using only 3 sheets of A3 paper and a roll of sellotape. The snag was it had to be able to stand up unaided, which gave our youngest children a chance to demonstrate some fantastic collaboration and lateral thinking.



**Grow £5 Project:** As part of their financial education, **Y6** pupils are currently working on their business plans for small group mini-enterprises, which they will run over the next few weeks at lunchtimes. This cross-curricular project is always a favourite with Y6, the aim being to make as much profit as possible from an investment of £5. Profits at the end go directly towards subsidies for school trips for the children. This year's stalls will include: photo booth, 10p drop and a lucky dip. Please consider allowing your child to support Y6, though obviously, there is no obligation.



This week, our "Be Safe" workshops ran successfully again for all year groups, exploring themes such as: how to keep safe on the streets; antibullying and healthy relationships. Y7 has a particularly useful day looking at consequences of risk taking behaviour to raise awareness around drugs. We were delighted to receive a thank you letter from the "Be Safe" organisation, complimenting Bellingham Middle pupils on their "hospitality towards visitors and engagement with the topic".





The Y7 and Y8 trip to Hawkhirst Activity Centre was a great success, with pupils rising to several physical and mental challenges. A fun day was had by all as they enjoyed: canoeing, raft building, pioneering and zip line. Staff were impressed with how well pupils further developed their understanding of the importance of teamwork, communication and leadership.
