Year 8



Badminton and Filmclub are after school on Thurs.



Book Fair—reading for pleasure

On the week beginning 23rd January we had a Book Fair through Scholastic as we tend to do every year.

Children were able to browse the books before making a decision and then buy books and other small items on Wednesday and Thursday.

What's happening in Enrichment this term?

As you may already know, we run 'enrichment' sessions on Friday afternoons for KS3. It meant that last term we were able to put on our successful Rockerfella production. The idea is to give our pupils a chance to do something extra that stems from their interests. This term the options were: orienteering, (PE / healthy living) 'voice' (centred around work on debating, speaking and listening skills) and 'small inventions' (science and technology).

In addition to this, year 5 will have the chance to work with the Tyne Rivers Trust to do a project called 'Salmon in the Classroom' which will feed into their science work. The programme starts with Tyne Rivers Trust setting up an aquarium and cooling system in the classroom. They will then bring the salmon eggs into classroom when they are close to hatching. Over a few weeks basic maintenance will be required (checking temperature and making sure the filters are clear) along with monitoring the hatch rate of the salmon, once all the eggs have hatched then they will return to take the class and the salmon to the local river to release them.
