HEADTEACHER MESSAGE

A warm welcome back to all our pupils and their families for the spring term at Bellingham Middle. Our two new pupils, Seb (Y7) and Lily (Y5) are settling in well, and everyone has been made an excellent start back after the holidays.

Our enrichment curriculum offer continues this term, with new exciting options for your children in First Aid, Floating Garden Design (STEM), unusual sports and children’s yoga/meditation. Years 5 and 6 are busy preparing to sing at the North East KS2 Choir of the Year at Durham Cathedral, with the support of local pianist Julia Kennard who teaches at the Chorister School next door. We are lucky to have this outreach project at no cost and pass our sincere thanks to her for her time and beautiful live accompaniment for the children to experience. Both Newcastle and Northumbria Universities will be visiting school over the next few weeks to work with all year groups, including an English Escape Room experience for younger pupils! We have also had notice yesterday that our busary application to cover the cost of attending Univenture in Newcastle was successful, so some of our older pupils will be visiting the university campus to broaden their horizons about future study options.

Your child may have shared with you that our free toast initiative has started this term. Although we already offer a free breakfast club to all pupils, we are aware that some pupils do not arrive early enough because of travelling long distances to be able to attend. We have therefore decided to also offer one slice of free toast at breaktime for any pupil. Those who want a second slice would still need to pay 20p. Other updates from the canteen include a request that any advance payments of lunch money for the week comes in on **Mondays in a named envelope, which your child should post in the school mail box.** Pay per day children should continue to do so, taking their money directly to the till each lunchtime as normal.

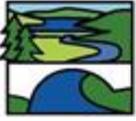

An attendance rate of 95% is generally considered good; this allows for children to miss 9.5 days across the year.




